Digital badges are achievements that you can show to the world. They are visual representations with embedded metadata that individuals can use to show verified competencies, skills or achievements. In short, badges are visual representations of a skill or achievement gained.

From Lake Superior's glacial and tectonic geology to its significance to indigenous peoples and importance to environmental research, the largest freshwater lake in the world makes a fascinating study. Embark on a journey exploring western and southern Lake Superior, including a history of the Twin Ports, field trips to historical sites and presentations by local indigenous elders and historians. THE SADIE ANN

The University of Wisconsin-Superior's Sadie Ann Floating Classroom and Research Vessel will lead educational and research-based voyages into the beautiful waters of Lake Superior. This research vessel will be managed by UW-Superior's Lake Superior Research Institute (LSRI) and docked at LSRI's ballast water research facility at Montreal Pier in Superior.

The catamaran-style research vessel, which is currently being built by Midship Marine in Harvey, Louisiana. This stable, quiet hybrid catamaran will enable UW-Superior's LSRI to continue and expand freshwater research initiatives, as well as provide opportunities for students of all ages and community members to connect with Lake Superior.

Supporting Education and Research

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
The Sadie Ann will be available to use by guest educators at all levels and disciplines, as well as scientists and researchers from outside the university. Organizations interested in workforce training and outreach programming will also be able to utilize the vessel.

The vessel will have heat and AC and the on-board equipment includes upper and main deck winches, a davit, and an A-frame for sampling.

The main deck will have fully furnished wet and dry research labs, a moon pool opening and fold-down diving platforms for sampling and analysis. A reinforced hull will allow operation in light winter conditions and the 4.6-foot draft will be operable in nearshore areas. A large classroom on the second deck with internet and communication technology will provide a flexible educational space.
